



RESTORING THE EARTH AND HARVESTING LIFE

It is a joy to consolidate our initiatives and the different projects that make up Camocim, while also highlighting our history of positive socio-environmental impact. In this process, many memories are rekindled, with the certainty that we remain committed to choices made long before me. For example, when my grandfather, Olivar Araújo, purchased this land and pursued his passion for planting trees. Accompanying him in the fields taught me that we must build a harmonious relationship with nature.

His legacy of respect and connection with the environment guides my decisions and Camocim's strategic choices. In 1996, we began producing organic coffee. From then on, we have continually sought improvement and sustainable innovation. Along this journey, we embraced biodynamic processes, which carry ancient and holistic wisdom. As a result, in 2008 we obtained the Demeter certification.

In 2023, we began working toward a new certification: Regenerative Organic Certified®. We are deeply honored to be the first coffee farm in Brazil to achieve this groundbreaking certification, which represents the highest standard of organic agriculture in the world, with rigorous requirements for animal welfare, soil health, and social fairness.

In 2025, we reached another milestone that fills us with pride: Fazenda Camocim was recognized as a Sustainable Farm in the prestigious Globo Rural magazine award, earning 1st place in the medium-sized farm category. This recognition reinforces the consistency of the work we have carried out over the past 20 years and reaffirms our commitment to balanced, ethical, and regenerative agricultural production.

Our successful journey is the result of the work of many people who share our values and are committed to building a better world. We are deeply grateful to our customers, who value quality and choose our organic, biodynamic, and regenerative coffee, joining this network of positive socio-environmental impact.

Every day, you inspire us to cultivate the finest specialty coffee, provide new sensory experiences, and above all, continue as partners of nature.

We aim to share our experience in nature-based solutions so that more people feel inspired to create a synergistic relationship with the planet. In 2025, we were selected as one of five projects chosen by the Nature Investment Lab for financial advisory support, with the goal of structuring and enabling this model for more producers in the region — an important step toward expanding the reach and effectiveness of regenerative practices.

OUR HOME

We are an ecological corridor of Tropical Atlantic Forest, committed to preserving and promoting local biodiversity.

Fazenda Camocim and the associate partners are situated in Pedra Azul, a mountainous region of Espírito Santo in Southeast Brazil. We occupy over 300 hectares amidst the Tropical Atlantic Forest at an altitude of 1200 meters, boasting a microclimate ideal for producing specialty coffees.

All these integrated initiatives ensure significant carbon sequestration in the soil, representing an important contribution of our business to climate change mitigation.

In our farms, we cultivate over 450,000 coffee plants using an agroforestry system, leveraging the forest's strengths to benefit our crops. Our coffee plants are shaded by diverse native trees, enriching the soil and naturally controlling pests. We maintain Legal Reserves and Permanent Preservation Areas covering one-third of our property. Our goal is to preserve water resources, landscapes, geological stability, biodiversity, soil, and ensure the well-being of people.

At Camocim, we are privileged to have 5 water springs and 7 reservoirs. Planting and preserving in these areas are priority projects to ensure an optimal environment for protecting and maintaining this invaluable resource.

In 2025, we expanded and renewed our coffee fields by introducing 5,000 plants of more productive varieties adapted to biodynamic cultivation.

OUR ENVIRONMENT IS A LABORATORY OF LIFE

Bees boost farm productivity

Bees play a crucial role in maintaining biodiversity, preserving natural resources, and enhancing agricultural productivity. Pollination using bees is an environmental service that acts as a new type of agricultural input, contributing to increased yields and improved crop quality.

Since 2010, Camocim Farm has benefited from the expertise of Florin Apiary, a family-owned agro-industry created by Arno Wieringa, a beekeeper, agronomist, and consultant committed to integrating apiculture and agriculture to maximise productivity and environmental stewardship.

SUSTAINABILITY IS ALSO A CORE PRINCIPLE OF OUR OPERATIONS

Sustainability is a principle that guides every decision at Camocim — from the way we produce to how we manage and consume resources. **We began 2025 operating with 100% renewable energy, made possible by the installation of 300 m² of solar panels**, which generate all the electricity needed to support our activities in a clean and efficient manner.

To enhance the quality and precision of our processes, we invested in modernizing our production infrastructure, incorporating **new equipment to improve bean sorting and upgrading our drying facilities** to ensure a more stable and carefully controlled drying process, aligned with best agro-industrial practices.

We also expanded **our production capacity with a new roaster**, allowing us to meet the growing demand of the domestic market with greater quality, consistency, and agility.

In an important step toward diversification and innovation, **we built a facility dedicated to jam production**, following the most rigorous industrial good manufacturing practices. This new venture increases the use of the farm's cultivated biodiversity and reinforces our commitment to natural, responsibly sourced, and high value-added products.

Each of these initiatives reaffirms that, for us, sustainability is not merely an operational pillar — it is the foundation guiding the regenerative future we are building, integrating clean energy, productive innovation, and biodiversity stewardship into every stage of our work.

AN ANCESTRAL MARRIAGE: PLANT AND MYCORRHIZA

In 2023, we launched the Mycorrhiza Project. This initiative focuses on multiplying the symbiotic mycorrhizal fungi present in the soil, which, when in contact with plant roots, promote the solubilization of nutrients and water—especially phosphorus—thus supporting improved root development. As a result, plants become stronger in the face of extreme climate events, contributing to greater resilience in coffee cultivation and increased productivity.

In 2025, we deepened our collaboration with professionals and university researchers to identify pathways for expanding the dissemination of this knowledge and scaling this practice both on our farm and in neighboring properties, thereby strengthening the project's positive impact throughout the region.




Portfolio organization and new packaging

In the first half of 2025, we carried out a strategic review of the Camocim portfolio, with the goal of offering Brazilian consumers an even more distinctive selection of coffees. The process included an analysis of the sensory profiles of our products and consumer trends, reinforcing an offering aligned with excellence, identity, and innovation.

As a result, we updated all our packaging to strengthen clearer communication more

closely connected to our branding, developed by Ronaldo Barbosa. Inspired by the landscapes of the farm and the colors that characterize our coffees, the new design — created by the Balaio agency — authentically expresses the connection between origin, quality, and purpose, which are the pillars of the Camocim experience.

OUR CERTIFICATIONS



Certifying our processes to continue innovating

WE ARE ORGANIC

Organic production demands methodology, technology, planning, and dedication from our field team.

Since 1996, when we began our work with specialty coffees at Fazenda Camocim, we chose to produce high-quality organic coffee without the use of pesticides. We invested in professional guidance to adopt the best management practices.

In 1999, we were certified by IBD (Biodynamic Institute), ensuring the authenticity of our production without any chemical

additives. IBD is the largest certifier in Latin America and the only Brazilian certifier for organic products. The IBD certification holds international credibility and is monitored by institutions such as IFOAM (International Federation of Organic Agriculture Movements) in England, DAR in Germany, USDA in the United States, and JAS in Japan.



WE ARE BIODYNAMIC



Biodynamics aims to renew agricultural practices, heal our soils, and produce food that truly nourishes humans. Similar to organic agriculture, biodynamic agriculture avoids synthetic fertilizers, pesticides, transgenic seeds, antibiotics, and hormones.

Biodynamic agriculture is based on the systematic knowledge of philosopher Rudolf Steiner, involving the relationship between soil, plant, animal, human, and cosmos. To connect the earth and cosmos, biodynamics uses homeopathic preparations made from cow manure, minerals, and medicinal plants to revitalize the soil. These preparations act as process catalysts and enhance plants' intrinsic ability to produce nutrients.

At Fazenda Camocim, we follow our own biodynamic calendar that determines the ideal timing for each plant care stage. Since 2008, we have been certified by Demeter, joining an international ecological network connected to Demeter International based in Germany.

WE PRACTICE REGENERATIVE ORGANIC AGRICULTURE

Our pursuit of continuous improvement in our relationship with nature and our business model has led us to become **the first Brazilian farm and company of specialty coffees to achieve Regenerative Organic Certified (ROC)**, built upon internationally recognized organic programs like USDA Organic.

The innovation lies in the integrated approach evaluated across three pillars:

- **Soil health and land management:** considers the increase in organic matter and soil life over time, and carbon sequestration.
- **Animal welfare:** assesses how the company creates favorable conditions for animal life and promotes biodiversity.
- **Social justice for farmers and workers:** a new and highly relevant perspective aiming to identify economic stability and dignity for farmers and rural workers, benefiting society as a whole.

As a species primarily associated with forest environments, the Jacu (*Penelope obscura*) prefers well-preserved woodlands for feeding, nesting, and resting. Its habits further reinforce the importance of continuing our mission to protect biodiversity and ensure a healthy environment for the conservation of the species.

Since 2015, we have joined efforts with the Instituto da Biodiversidade (IBIO), which has been working for over 20 years with a focus on scientific research and environmental education, to jointly develop monitoring initiatives for the Jacu and other wildlife present on the farm.

In 2025, we celebrate 10 years of this important partnership, marked by consolidated projects involving systematic wildlife surveys, with a focus on birds and medium- and large-sized mammals, as well as initiatives aimed at developing environmental education practices and participating in municipal councils and socio-environmental policy development processes.

Preserving the Jacu means preserving many other species that inhabit the Atlantic Forest — it means preserving the entire ecosystem.

Next Steps:

Maintain constant monitoring of the Dusky-Legged Guan and enhance new studies.

Expand to other species in the region with a focus on community involvement in environmental preservation.

Develop new partnerships to enable project expansion.

JACU BIRD



Name: *Penelope obscura*, known as Dusky-Legged Guan or Jacu

Weight: up to 1,200 kilograms

Centimetres: up to 73 centimeters

- They are monogamous and lay 2 to 3 eggs per year.
- They live freely in flocks of 6 to 10 birds.
- They are associated with forests.
- The subspecies *Penelope obscura bronzina*, found at Fazenda Camocim, is endemic to the Southeast Tropical Atlantic Forest of Brazil.

They are also found in Uruguay, Paraguay, Argentina, and Bolivia.

Curiosities:

They are large and noisy species, notable for the loud, peculiar noise they make with their wings while flying.

CUPPING EXPERIENCE

To complete the Camocim experience, we have a café located within the farm, waiting for you. With a modern design fully integrated into nature, we drew inspiration from traditional farmhouse architecture to create a welcoming environment for our visitors, partners, and special guests.

Casa do Café is a space designed to offer a sensory experience — to explore aromas and connect with our history. In 2025, we carried out a project with Sebrae – ES to further enhance and train our team in best service practices. We also invested in the creation of two unique coffee tasting and pairing experiences, as well as the development of a new menu. Our goal is to provide our visitors with a memorable tourism experience.

Casa do Café is also the exclusive place where we offer several special editions, such as Casa Camocim 2019 — a coffee aged in our cold chambers at -25°C for 18 months. It presents aromas of dried fruits, fine woods, dark chocolate, and nuts — an invitation to explore olive groves and travel back in time.

Since 2020, we have recorded consistent annual growth of 15%, driven by process improvements, enhanced quality, increasing market interest in organic and biodynamic products, and the introduction of our roasted beans into the Brazilian market.

STRATEGIES TO MULTIPLY IMPACT

Sharing knowledge and promoting best practices lie at the heart of our strategy. We believe that expanding the network of regenerative coffee producers strengthens the territory and generates benefits for farmers, consumers, and the regional ecosystem. For this reason, we structured a project to engage producers neighboring Fazenda Camocim in regenerative practices, offering technical training, patient capital, and access to our national and international buyer network.

In 2025, the initiative was selected as one of five Brazilian projects chosen for the first edition of the Nature

Investment Lab (NIL), a financial advisory program focused on structuring nature-based businesses. Participation in the NIL contributed to enhancing financial analysis, validating technical assumptions, and defining sustainable expansion strategies.

This progress reinforces our conviction that regenerative agriculture thrives when it is shared and organized in networks, expanding impact and safeguarding the future of coffee cultivation in the region.

Camocim has proven to be a positive surprise within the impact ecosystem. It is rare to find a solid company, with an experienced team and stable operations, that at the same time demonstrates a genuine intention to produce coffee while restoring nature.

Within the context of the Nature Investment Lab (NIL), Camocim was one of five companies selected — out of 86 applicants — to receive support in its fundraising journey. Its objective in the NIL was to secure the capital needed to enable CaféBio, a program designed to expand production across neighboring smallholder farms.

Throughout the process, we presented various financial instruments previously unfamiliar to Camocim, ranging from catalytic and philanthropic capital to capital market instruments.

Development banks, funders, and investors have recognized Camocim's potential and have been engaging to offer the best possible conditions to advance this remarkable project.

In 2025, Fazenda Camocim received one of the most relevant recognitions in the Brazilian agribusiness sector: the Sustainable Farm Award from Globo Rural magazine, achieving 1st place in the medium-sized farm category. The award highlights properties that demonstrate leadership in responsible practices, environmental innovation, and socio-economic commitment, reinforcing our position as a national reference in organic, biodynamic, and regenerative agriculture.

The selection process is conducted by independent experts who evaluate indicators such as soil management, biodiversity, water stewardship, animal welfare, social impact, and productive efficiency. This recognition confirms the consistency of the choices made over more than 20 years and the strength of the

agricultural model we have built.

More than an achievement, the award symbolizes the consolidation of a journey guided by respect for the land and environmental regeneration, strengthening our responsibility toward the future of sustainable agriculture in Brazil.

Our field of innovation will also expand, both through the development of new products derived from fruits and mushrooms cultivated on the farm, and through the supply of natural inputs to the cosmetics industry.

On the commercial front, we plan to broaden our presence in new international markets, including Eastern Europe and Latin America, while further strengthening the consolidation of our brand in Brazil. This expansion reflects our purpose of connecting origin, quality, and socio-environmental responsibility to consumers who value more transparent relationships with the planet.



Our dedication extends to enhancing processes and promoting regeneration in our production practices, including launching new products derived from fruits and mushrooms cultivated on the farm. Commercial plans are ambitious, targeting new external markets such as Eastern Europe and Latin America. We will also consolidate our brand in

Brazil through a differentiated online experience. Our journey demonstrates that we are on the right path, committed to walking hand in hand with nature, preserving and regenerating the land.
